FROM THE CHAIRMAN

ANDREW JENKINS

A warm Brunton Park welcome to our friends from Barrow, which includes their directors, players and supporters.

They, like ourselves, had a difficult time last season fighting for points at the wrong end of the table. It's good to see that both clubs have reversed their form and are enjoying competing at the top of League Two.

It is early days yet but let's hope the form continues to the end of the season. We do expect a competitive game, hopefully with a large crowd, and from our point of view we want to look to respond to the defeat we suffered recently in the Papa Johns Trophy.

It was disappointing not to get the three points last Saturday against Sutton but, to be honest, and as Paul has said, we didn't deserve it as we didn't quite do enough to disrupt their game plan.

We do appear to struggle for results with teams who have recently come up from the National League, as it has proved with Harrogate and Sutton. I was really disappointed with the referee again last Saturday and I am sick of seeing officials being booed off at full time.

He was not favouring either team, but his decisions were all over the place and, when that's the case, the officials tend to lose the respect of the players and the supporters. As we saw, it ended up with a confrontation. More and more we're seeing things happen which shouldn't, partly due to officiating that only serves to stoke things up. This has become more frequent at recent games.

We are in danger of getting another letter from the FA on player and crowd behaviour, and I would ask supporters to refrain from throwing things. I understand it was chewing gum last Saturday – whatever it is, it isn't acceptable, and it's something we must stop from happening.

I was told last Saturday's referee was a trialist in terms of EFL fixtures this season. It's certainly a remark I had never heard of in my 62 years in football. I would have thought, as there were no Premiership or Championship games, that there would be sufficient officials who must have been available.

It was good to see Jimmy Glass at the game, with the Glass Bar named in his honour. He looked fit and well and is always given a big welcome when he visits us.

I was so sorry to hear of the loss of Barry Carter, who has been poorly for a while. Barry was our disabled fan representative and went to all the games home and away, and he will be sadly missed. So many of us knew him, a True Blue indeed.

Back to the football and let's hope its onwards and upwards after today's derby match.

FROM THE MANAGER

PAUL SIMPSON

Good afternoon and welcome to today's game against Barrow. I also welcome Pete, his staff and players for a game that always brings with it a lot of interest.

They come here having suffered a heavy defeat at Stevenage in their last game, and I'm sure they'll be looking to remind people why they are where they are in the table. Results like that can happen, and it's up to us to make sure that they don't use today as a means of bouncing back.

This is the first of a run of fixtures against teams who are in the top seven beside us and it certainly provides an opportunity for us to both cement the good work done so far and to pick up more important points. None of it is ever easy, but we're also where we are in the table because of the way we've gone about things. The challenge is for us to do what has to be done make sure it continues.

We spoke after our game last Saturday about the fact that the level of performance was below what we want to see, but it's another indication of how far we've come that we do feel frustrated, even though it was another one that we didn't lose. We're demanding more of each other all the time, and that's never a bad thing.

through the review process that we see that there were still plenty of things to be positive about. We controlled it for long periods, we put together some good footballing moves, we kept going and we created a very good goal from a set piece that had been practiced out on the training pitch.



We also climbed another place to fifth spot and we continue to be very difficult to beat. That is a good trait to have and, as we've said before, the next step for this group is to turn some of those types of games that are ending in draws into wins.

This is a very good group of players, they know when they haven't quite been at it, and that's another positive thing for us to have. Last weekend was an example of where it needed a collective spark, and hopefully we can all come together this Saturday to make sure we're doing everything we can to make it a vibrant atmosphere from the moment the first whistle goes.

United fans were back at Holker Street for the first time in over 56 years for what is loosely termed the Cumbrian Derby.

United showed first when Riley fed a throw up the right flank. Dennis touched it on, Patrick crossed, and Platt was there to clear. It went as far as Dennis and he opted for a volley from the edge of the box. He couldn't keep it down and it sailed over the bar.

The away side earned a corner when they worked their way up the left flank, with Mellish patient with the pass. Dennis made a deft touch with his back to goal, and the release allowed Patrick to step inside. He spotted Dickenson in space, but the 20-yarder took a deflection and spun past the upright.

Carlisle took the lead with a real moment of quality on 32 minutes when a header forward was initially touched by Patrick. Jordan Gibson took over and he caught Farman on his heels with a rocket of a shot from just outside the box. It smashed against the inside of the post and bulged the corner of the net.

There was a real chance for the visitors to double the lead on 40 minutes when an overlap from Riley brought a half-clearance. Dickenson controlled on his chest, touched it through legs and then went for glory with a fizzed punt. Farman jumped to cover but it was always going high.

Barrow should have equalised just before the break when a Rooney free kick was nodded down by Amadi-Holloway. It somehow made its way through to Brough, and he had the goal at his mercy at very

close range. Mark Howard was excellent as he spread himself to make a point-blank block.

The hosts came out of the blocks sharply at the start of the second period and a free kick from deep from Rooney found Platt on the move. His diving header hit the angle of post and bar, and the follow-up cross from Rooney was put behind by Feeney as Canavan challenged.

The biggest home league crowd since Boxing Day 1969 included 612 away fans, and it was the visiting contingent that was sent wild when Simeu played a lovely ball forward. Dennis was onto it quickly, and he clipped it beyond Farman as he advanced to try to close things down. The retreating defenders could only watch in horror as it bobbed over the line.

But Barrow were right back in it just three minutes later when a corner fell at the feet of Ollie Banks. He made no mistake with a rifled volley that found the top corner.

A late free kick had to be dealt with, deep into time added on, but there was relief for the visitors as a later terrible set piece was sent high over the bar. That allowed the away team to manage the game through and claim a massive three points.

Here at Carlisle United Community Sports Trust we run a **Football Development Scholarship in partnership with LFE (League Football Education)**.

The two-year full-time course is a BTEC Level 3 extended diploma in sports coaching, which is the equivalent of 3 A-levels. The course allows 16-19 year olds the opportunity to train like a professional footballer whilst gaining a first class education at the same time.

The course is very diverse with a variety of units that prepare learners for further education or a job in the sports industry.

Units include: Health & Wellbeing, Sport Development, Self-Employment, Sports Coaching, Sports Injuries, Nutrition, Technology in sport and many more!

Previous students have gone onto work and study in many different areas. These include going to university to do sports coaching, sports journalism, sports therapy, sports science and PE teaching.

Other learners have set up their own football coaching businesses as well going onto be personal trainers and sports coaches.

The course is fantastic for the education and football playing side however the work-based qualifications completed are also very valuable to the learners. The students will complete their FA Playmaker course as well as the FA Level One in Football Coaching.

They will also complete work placement hours with our fantastic community coaches on our comprehensive

community programme. This includes going into Primary Schools to support with delivery of PE, Premier League Primary Stars and After School Clubs.

They will also have the opportunity to help out at CUFC Soccer Schools and other programmes such as Football for All and Walking Football. Learners will also complete regular tutorials throughout the year in many different and important areas. These include car safety, drug & alcohol awareness, heart start/first aid, CV writing and other valuable topics.

These experiences play a major part in developing knowledge and key skills such as teamwork, leadership and communication, putting the learners in the best possible position for when they finish the two-year course with us.

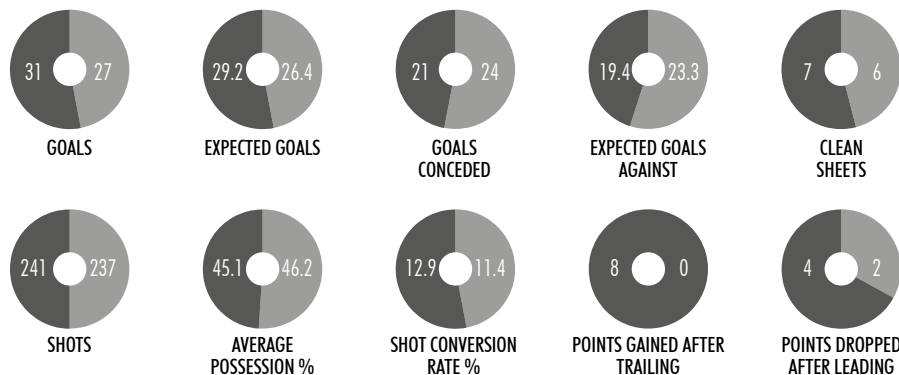

I remember an amateur game between two rival villages with a league title at stake. As usual in a local derby there was plenty of ‘banter’. The home fans were trying to distract the opposing keeper with constant jeering and he responded with a two fingered salute as he collected the ball for a goal kick. In a split second a voice in the crowd told him – “We didn’t ask for your IQ.”

Unfortunately, the behaviour of fans sometimes goes beyond what is acceptable, in particular the throwing of coins, flares and other objects or spectators running onto the pitch. The development of CCTV and more seated areas has made it easier to identify offenders but there has been a disappointing increase in incidents over recent months. The normally good-humoured pitch ‘invasions’ following a play-off win overstepped the mark at the end of last season when away team players were assaulted.

Those of us with first-hand experience of crowd disorder in the 1980s dread an escalation to the levels of that decade. Several clubs were notorious for having a large number of hooligans among their supporters and gangs used to arrange to meet for battles before games. Inevitably innocent bystanders could be caught up in the violence and seven police officers were injured during one running battle between Brighton and Chelsea ‘fans’ in 1983. Almost every week we heard reports of train carriages being wrecked.

There were also instances of thugs trying to stop games if their team was losing. This came dramatically to the nation’s attention on 13th March 1985 during a cup tie at Luton. Millwall followers smashed plastic seats and used them as weapons in a pitched battle with 200 police. Order was restored

sufficiently for the game to be completed after a 25-minute break, but there was a live TV broadcast of the game - so plenty of evidence for all to see.

The government blamed the football authorities for failing to tackle the problem and the FA responded that “these people are society’s problems and we don’t want your hooligans at our sport”. A government bill was passed banning the sale of alcohol at grounds and plans set out for a national identity card scheme.

Spectator numbers plummeted and as well as vandalism and aggression,, our football community suffered intense tragedies with the Bradford City fire and the Brussels Heysel Stadium stampede. The decade ended with the worst tragedy of all at Hillsborough.

Looking on the bright side, as far as I am aware, we haven’t had any large-scale problems with our Carlisle – Barrow derbies which date back to around 1904. Let’s hope that players and fans of both teams will enjoy an entertaining encounter with any banter and aggro limited to the level of that village match in which, incidentally the goalkeeper had the ‘last word’ with a clean sheet and a League winner’s medal.



Approaching the midway point of the season, this is the first of three games with other promotion contenders. Good results for The Blues now and in the first months of 2023, the return derby at Holker Street in April will be a promotion battle.

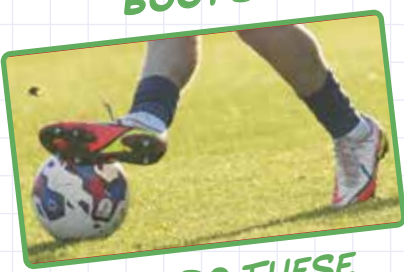

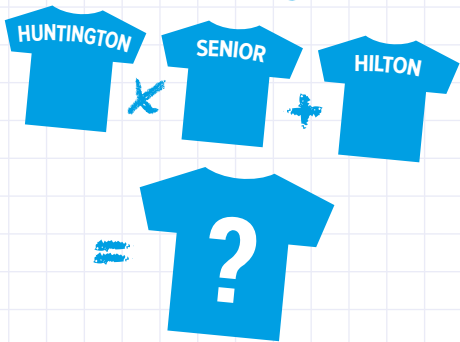

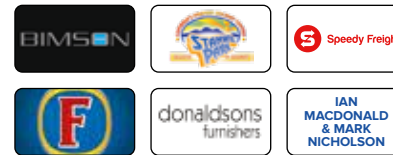
