**It was a lively atmosphere on a sunny afternoon and both sides went for it from the off.**

Carlisle started to show as the more likely and a good opening was fashioned as a corner was cleared only as far as Guy. Gibson stayed inside when a floated pass came his way, but he seemed to be caught in two minds as he sent it off into the stands behind the goal.

United were guilty of snatching at it once again when Killip came off his line to get fingertips to a wicked Moxon dipper. It fell for Dennis to hit, but he miscued it and it bent wide.

Holy was at his absolute best with a double save from Umerah and Hamilton from a corner at the other end. Both stops were instinctive and vital.

Gibson blazed wide from 19-yards as the Cumbrians enjoyed the bulk of the pressure, with Armer screaming at him to send it his way, and a Moxon inspired break came to nothing as Stretton and Armer had crosses blocked.

Pools took the lead just before the break from another free kick from almost halfway up the pitch. The initial delivery was blocked, but Umerah kept it alive. Alex Lacey was unmarked and he made no mistake from close range as he thrashed it into the roof of the net.

Hartlepool were out of the second half blocks quickly, but it was the visitors who registered when Owen Moxon scored his second goal for the club. Possession was turned over in midfield and he got

his head down as he strode into space off the pass from Mellish. A measured, deliberate 20-yarder left Killip with no chance as it arrowed into his bottom corner.

The near 700 fans behind the goal were suddenly in fine voice, and they were appealing for a penalty as Huntington was hauled down as the second of two Moxon corners bent his way, but the referee said no and play went on.

Carlisle took the lead on 75 minutes and it was the decision to allow play to continue that made it happen, when Moxon was clearly fouled as he stabbed the ball through. Omari Patrick sprinted onto it, kept his cool, checked once, then again, then drilled it low and past the dive to register his first goal of the campaign.

Brilliance all-round brought the third goal for the visitors as Holy threw the ball to Gibson. He looked up, still 10-yards inside his own half, and a flighted a wonder pass towards the edge of the box. Patrick chested it then popped it past the advancing keeper, before putting it over the line to claim his second of the day.

**Here at Carlisle United Community Sports Trust we run a Football Development Scholarship in partnership with LFE (League Football Education).**

The two-year full-time course is a BTEC Level 3 extended diploma in sports coaching, which is the equivalent of 3 A-levels. The course allows 16-19 year olds the opportunity to train like a professional footballer whilst gaining a first class education at the same time.

The course is very diverse with a variety of units that prepare learners for further education or a job in the sports industry.

Units include: Health & Wellbeing, Sport Development, Self-Employment, Sports Coaching, Sports Injuries, Nutrition, Technology in sport and many more!

Previous students have gone onto work and study in many different areas. These include going to university to do sports coaching, sports journalism, sports therapy, sports science and PE teaching.

Other learners have set up their own football coaching businesses as well going onto be personal trainers and sports coaches.

The course is fantastic for the education and football playing side however the work-based qualifications completed are also very valuable to the learners. The students will complete their FA Playmaker course as well as the FA Level One in Football Coaching.

They will also complete work placement hours with our fantastic community coaches on our comprehensive

community programme. This includes going into Primary Schools to support with delivery of PE, Premier League Primary Stars and After School Clubs.

They will also have the opportunity to help out at CUFC Soccer Schools and other programmes such as Football for All and Walking Football. Learners will also complete regular tutorials throughout the year in many different and important areas. These include car safety, drug & alcohol awareness, heart start/first aid, CV writing and other valuable topics.

These experiences play a major part in developing knowledge and key skills such as teamwork, leadership and communication, putting the learners in the best possible position for when they finish the two-year course with us.

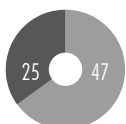

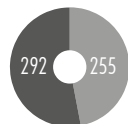

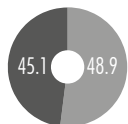

A popular former Blues manager, Keith Curle, is back at Brunton Park tonight.

Keith brings his Hartlepool squad for the game originally scheduled for 7 January. They were otherwise engaged that weekend playing Stoke City in the FA Cup. There was to be no cup glory for the Pool, who lost 3-0.



In my last article I introduced the theme of footballing fathers and sons and sure enough a few examples have since popped up. One of Stoke's goals at Hartlepool was scored by **Liam Delap** ⚡, son of former Carlisle and Stoke midfielder Rory, renowned for his long

throw-in. Last week Liam was recalled from his loan spell at Stoke by parent club Manchester City but then put to Preston for the rest of the season.

As Sheffield Wednesday warmed up for their tie with Newcastle, viewers were informed that Dean Windass's son was playing. My first thought was 'Does Josh get cheesed off at frequently being introduced that way?' Josh let his boots do the talking with two goals for his EFL1 team's win against the Premier League visitors. I'm sure that father, Deano, who played for Hull City during their brief Premier League spell, is proud of son Josh's achievement with Wednesday.

Among the brief snippets of action in ITV's EFL Highlights broadcast we saw Jensen Weir score in Morecambe's 2-1 win against Cheltenham.

This was the Shrimps' third successive win, Jensen scoring in all three, and mention was made that he is the son of former Everton defender David. Jensen is on loan from Brighton where his father is on the coaching staff. He has had an interesting development, starting with Wigan Athletic but being sold to Brighton during the Latics' financial difficulties. Jensen represented Scotland at Under 16 and Under 17 before then accepting the invitation to play for England U-17s and he has more recently played at Under 20 level for England. David had a long career with Falkirk, Hearts, Everton and finally Rangers, earning full international caps, his last at the age of 40 making him Scotland's oldest player.

The following Tuesday evening, I spotted the name Aaron Pressley as scorer of Accrington's goals in their Trophy quarter-final 2-2 draw at Lincoln. He scored again in Stanley's 3-1 shoot-out win. He is on loan from Brentford where father Steven Pressley is a coach. Another Scottish international central defender, Steven was, of course, more recently a Carlisle United manager.

I still enjoy the FA Cup even if the competition has been devalued to some degree by clubs fielding under-strength teams. Wrexham enjoyed a thrilling 4-3 win at Coventry, but maybe the biggest shock was supplied by Stevenage. Trailing by the only goal at Villa Park, they equalised with a last minute penalty before Dean Campbell fired in the winner in added time. I have watched Dean's progress with interest as his family is part of a wider Caithness family, a couple of whom, father and son, both named Grant, played for 'my' local Highland League club, Wick Academy. Another member of that Campbell clan is Hibernian midfielder Josh.

Dean and his Stevenage team-mates continued involvement in the FA Cup will maybe distract them from their promotion challenge. Maybe their visit to Brunton Park in March will have a place in the top three at stake. Maybe... Yeah, I'm getting carried away. One game at a time! Come on you Blues!
