FROM THE CHAIRMAN

I'm writing these notes ahead of our trip to Wimbledon as, with this being a double programme for both the Mansfield and Colchester fixtures, the print deadline is slightly earlier than normal.

Combining the programmes is something we've done on a number of occasions over the course of the past two seasons. With this being a double issue programme for the Mansfield and Colchester games it's a welcome to Nigel, Matt and their staff and players for both of these fixtures.

It also means that I've had to put these notes together ahead of our trip to Wimbledon. That's a new stadium to visit for many of us, which is always interesting, and there is no doubt that it will have been another tough game. Wimbledon have picked up a lot of draws along the way and I'm sure, like us, they'll be able to point to some of those games as opportunities missed.

At this stage of the season teams are looking for points for their own reasons, be that with the top or bottom end of the table in mind. That's why nothing can ever be taken for granted and each game has to be approached on its own merits. Mansfield and Colchester will be here looking to give a good account of themselves and, as ever, it will come down to what we do that will determine the outcome for us.

Our last home game against Harrogate was a frustrating one. Without creating the really clear-cut chances we certainly looked the more likely, and I don't recall our target being troubled at all, other than by our late mistake. That's what probably added to the feelings of frustration because we left the ground knowing that it was one we shouldn't have lost.

However, as I have reminded people many times, these things happen in football. It's now about

a reaction and making sure that one negative result – that was only our second home league defeat of the season – doesn't start to weigh on minds. We have worked hard and kept the focus through the first 29 games and that's taken us to where we are in the table.



Whatever challenges are to come, it's by continuing to do things properly that we will give us the best chance of achieving something. We've got ourselves into a great position, and we can't take for granted the hard work that's got us there.

Much of what we've done leading up to this run of games has been centred around the need to drive standards and constantly push ourselves and each other, because that has been a big part of what we've done so far.

A home turnout of over six thousand for our last weekend fixture was another increase, which is absolutely brilliant, and all we can ask is that you continue to do your bit. I can't repeat enough how much we appreciate it and how important it is.

Enjoy both games and thank you for your support.

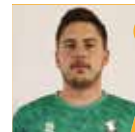

CONNECTIONS

WITH KEN WOOD

Over the years the Scottish Cup has served up fewer shock results than the FA Cup. I remember Berwick Rangers 1 Rangers 0 fifty plus years ago and Celtic losing at home to Inverness Caledonian Thistle in 2000, which prompted the 'Sun' headline 'Super Caley Go Ballistic, Celtic Are Atrocious'.

Berwick and ICT were Scottish League lower division clubs and to find a non-league team beating a top league team you have to go back to 1959 when Highland League Fraserburgh beat Dundee 1-0.

Gradually in recent years, entry has opened up to include former Junior clubs who now compete in the lower echelons of the SPFL pyramid. The West of Scotland League is particularly strong with Auchinleck Talbot the best known and most successful team.

This season, my local team, Wick Academy, beat a couple of ex-Junior teams to reach the Third Round where we lost 6-0 to Falkirk. That same day, a win by Ayrshire village team, Darvel, 5-2 at Montrose caused a few raised eyebrows. They were rewarded with a home tie to Aberdeen and with six weeks to prepare, opted to speed up their planned ground improvements to be allowed to play the tie on their own Recreation Park.

BBC Scotland chose the match for a live TV broadcast so it was scheduled for the evening of Monday 23 January. Darvel owner and chairman, John Gall, was interviewed on the Scottish news a couple of hours before kick-off and was modestly confident that his team would put on a good performance.

In the SportsScene pre-match chat, former Aberdeen skipper and manager, Willie Miller, said, "This is the start of the road to Hampden for Aberdeen. It's going to be a tricky tie for them but they have enough quality to win the tie, I'm sure about that."

Aberdeen started well and created a few chances early doors. However, they were rocked in the 19th minute when Jordan Kirkpatrick spun round about ten yards from goal on to a weak clearance and steered the ball low into the net. From then on, the Ayrshire part-timers more than held their own and at half-time Willie Miller changed his tune to say, "The first 45 minutes belong to Darvel."

Good afternoon, and welcome to today's match against Mansfield Town.

Carlisle United Community Sports Trust (CUFC CST) have been working within local primary schools to deliver the 'Premier League Primary Stars'(PLPS) program since 2016. P.L Primary Stars uses the appeal of the Premier League and professional football clubs to inspire children to learn, be active and develop important life skills. Available to every primary school in England and Wales, it inspires girls and boys aged 5-11 in the classroom, the playground and on the sports field. Learning is connected to the real world of sport to enthuse pupils when tackling challenging PSHE topics such as resilience, diversity, self-esteem, and nutrition. Our vision is to inspire and create healthier and more positive futures for the children of Cumbria.

The P.L. Primary Stars program consists of:

- Teacher CPD and mentoring programme for the delivery of high-quality physical education.
- Classroom sessions covering PSHE (Physical, Social, Health and Education).
- Maths and English intervention sessions.
- Health and well-being assemblies.
- The integration of literacy and numeracy within sports
- Mass participation events and tournaments for pupils, teachers and schools to attend.

The focus is on developing the whole child – improving their physical literacy, enhancing their learning, and teaching them relevant skills and behaviours that they can carry with them into later life.

- **Be inspiring** – set a great example to others
- **Be connected** – work well with others and in a team


