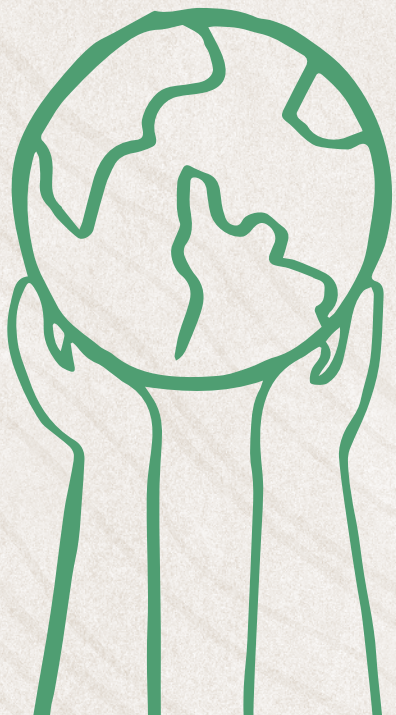

I would like to welcome the directors, players, officials and supporters of both Northampton and Stockport as they come to us for their respective games.

This is another combined issue of our match programme as the club continues to look at different ways of producing this publication. As we said last time we did this, we've tried a number of different approaches, with magazines and bumper issues included, but people appear to have moved their reading habits online. I know our operational team will be making a decision on what we're doing with it going forward in the very near future.

I have to say thank you to every supporter who made the trip to Walsall on Monday. It seemed to be one of those days where if it could go wrong, it did, with at least two major crashes causing severe congestion. The atmosphere inside during the 90 minutes was exactly what the manager asked for, helped by two really good first half goals.

I'd like to say well done to Kris Dennis for reaching 20 goals for the season. I know he wants to make it 20 league goals, and add even more to that if he can. It's an excellent number to reach, we haven't seen it too many times from an individual in recent years, and it's something he can be very proud of.

Heading into the Northampton game we have five fixtures left to play. I know the players, coaches and manager will be doing everything they can to make it a very good end to what has been a tough season. Thank you once again for your efforts in helping them along the way.

Once again, the dedication of our fan base was demonstrated with the Monday trip to Walsall. Some buses and cars were stuck on the M6 for hours, with a group of fans not making it to the Bescot until after half time. Over a thousand eventually making it is incredible, and very much appreciated.

Back at Brunton Park, with two games over the next four days it's about respecting two very good opponents whilst, at the same time, making sure we do our jobs properly. If we're at it, and if we're on our game as a unit, we'll be giving ourselves a really good chance.

I have been asked a few times about the seemingly throwaway remarks in my article a couple of months ago about conversations with Alex Ferguson → and meeting Arsenal goalkeepers. If I was to tell the stories on one of my wife's addictive TV shows 'Would I Lie to You?', I would have to admit that it was in fact true.

I have indeed enjoyed a few conversations with Sir Alex over the years, the most recent one, over 20 years ago. By good luck I was in Aberdeen for a few days in December 1999 when he was promoting his autobiography, 'Managing My Life' with a book signing event. Anticipating a big queue that morning, I arrived an hour early.

A couple of hundred people were already ahead of me, but by good chance there was a 2pm session in another book-shop so I opted to be early for that one.

Alex skipped his lunch break and started at 1.30 and I was soon inside buying half a dozen copies. When I asked him to sign one for Wick Academy FC he remarked "I've been in Wick". He reminisced briefly about that visit in 1979 when our local Aberdeen Supporters Club had its first Player of the Year award evening.

As Wick was 220 miles north of Aberdeen (now thanks to 3 new bridges only 200 miles!), he opted to attend rather than risk the young unmarried player facing the temptations of a 2 night stay in the fleshpots of the Far North. As I moved away,



encouraged by one of the stewards, Alex called after me. "Hey Ken, I meant to say, Cathy still has that Cathness Glass thingy you gave us". He was referring to the replica of the famous Mastermind Trophy which we had engraved as a gift for him.

Before games he often came to greet our far travelled bus load of 'Dons' supporters but the next time we spoke was at a Youth tournament at Arbroath's Gayfield Park during the 1981 Easter holidays. My younger son, 10 years old at the time, fell and grazed his knee as he ran to retrieve the match-ball when it landed near us. We went under the Main Stand looking for the toilets so that he could wash the grit off the wound.

Teddy Scott, in charge of the Aberdeen youngsters, intercepted us in the corridor and ushered us into the Aberdeen changing room where he opened up the first aid kit and set about treating my son's knee. Moments later in walked Mr Ferguson who made a comment approximating 'cleanliness is next to godliness'.

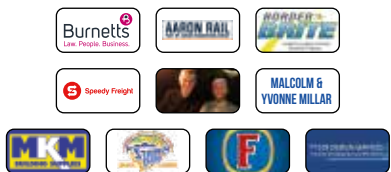

As for meeting Arsenal goalkeepers, my 'collection' is a quartet of internationals, one from each home nation. Around 1980, I took my same younger son, to Highbury and we called in at the club shop to buy a few programmes. We were told they were only available at the new bigger store at Finsbury Park.

A man from the back shop shouted *"Is it programmes you want?"* and came through to the counter, carrying a box. For once in my life I was lost for words – the shop manager was my boyhood hero, Jack Kelsey. He smiled and asked Jonathan *"Will you look after them?"* It was the collection of a recently deceased supporter whose wish was that they would be a gift to a potential collector. Those 300 have grown to a collection of nearly 2000.

We didn't really meet Pat Jennings but were at Stansted Airport in March 1997 when he walked past, having arrived off an Irish flight. Realising that he'd been recognised, Big Pat smiled and said hello.

I met **Bob Wilson** → when he did a book signing at the Emirates Stadium, around 2006. It was a Saturday around midday and I didn't have a ticket for the Arsenal match but that didn't bother me because I was on my way to a Carlisle game, somewhere in the London area.

I saw David Seaman in a few of his 400 odd Arsenal games as well as frequently on TV. With 75 caps David is second behind Peter Shilton for the most England appearances by a goalkeeper. I didn't know of his interest in angling so it was a real surprise when

I met him one summer evening in the Caithness village of Halkirk, where he was enjoying a week's fishing holiday. The Halkirk United football team who play in the North Caledonian League is quite appropriately nicknamed 'The Anglers'.

Pat Jennings played several times against Carlisle, but only as a Spurs player, including the game in September 1974 that put United top of the First Division, having won the first three games. Kelsey made his Arsenal first team debut in February 1951, about 6 weeks after the two cup ties with Carlisle when Ted Platt was their keeper. Jack was outstanding in his 1958 World Cup appearances for Wales in Sweden. I saw him in a dozen or so Arsenal games when I lived near London.



Wilson was member of Arsenal's 1970/1 double winning team, but missed part of the 1972/3 season with an injury, including the cup games with Carlisle when Geoff Barnett deputised between the sticks. In 74/5 Jimmy Rimmer was an ever-present as Arsenal's keeper, playing in both Carlisle games. Seaman was at Highbury for 12 seasons from 1992 but was missing when the Gunners came to Brunton Park in January 2001. Alex Manninger, the young Austrian international kept a clean sheet that day in Arsenal's 1-0 win.

I'm unlikely to meet anyone really famous at Brunton Park this weekend but I'm very much looking forward to the two games, which at the time of writing seem likely to involve three promotion contenders. Come on you Blues!
