

### MANAGER MATT TAYLOR

Matt Taylor was appointed manager of Exeter City in June 2018 following the departure of long-serving boss Paul Tisdale. His first season in charge of the Grecians saw them finish ninth in Sky Bet League Two, only a point outside the play-off places.

Matt made more than 150 appearances for the Grecians as a player so is a popular figure among the St James Park faithful. As a tough-tackling, physical defender, Matt helped City to back-to-back promotions from the Football Conference to League One during his first spell at the club before going on to play for Charlton Athletic and Cheltenham Town.


Matt started his playing career off at non-league Burscough as a goalkeeper and helped the Linnets to an FA Trophy win over Tamworth in the 2002/03 season.

He spent a number of years at non-league level, before getting his break at Exeter City in 2007 where he helped them to promotion in his first season at the club by making 46 appearances at the centre of defence and scoring nine goals. Matt then played 34 games the following season to help the Grecians to back-to-back promotions to League One and featured heavily for City in the third tier of English football before moving to Charlton the following summer.

Matt made his first team debut in the Football League Trophy over Wycombe Wanderers in 2013 at the age of 17.

The striker, known for his great technical ability and quick feet, has had two successful loan spells at Hayes & Yeading and Truro City. His first goal for City came in the EFL Trophy in August 2016 as he fired home a first-time shot against Oxford United at the Kassam Stadium.

Matt continued his development as he netted his first league goal against Cambridge United in the 2017/18 season, and he managed to find the net four times in the

2018/19 campaign - three of which were contenders for goal of the season.

MJ's standout season came last time out as he took home all the awards after his 20 goal haul. He was awarded a place in two separate League Two Team of the Years, as well as winning Player of the Year and Player's Player of the Year in the club's awards.

He has been handed the captaincy by Matt Taylor for the 2021/22 season.

Carlisle had to be patient but it was a fine example of counter-attacking football which eventually earned them their three points as Magpies youngster Alex Gilliead marked a fine personal display with a deserved winning goal.

An early long range drive from Davies sailed high over the bar and another drilled shot from Grant flew past the post as Exeter had the better of the chances just after kick off.

Carlisle attacked with purpose through a run from Sweeney and Grainger took over with a fierce cross into the area. A deflection sent Wyke wide and his return delivery had to be hooked clear as Gilliead lurked.

A loose pass from Hery caused real problems as Holmes overlapped but Atkinson was alert and he made a vital block as a shot came in. Atkinson was the man on the spot again for the next delivery as he lunged forward to block from Grant as a flick took the keeper out of the game.

The Cumbrians used the right flank to create their first good opening as Gilliead beat two to get into the area. His deflected cut back was behind Wyke and Sweeney couldn't quite get there.

Exeter broke quickly as they regained possession and Wheeler lobbed a high ball to the back stick as away

shirts arrived late. Holmes nodded it down but Grant failed to control his whipped volley.

Another good Danny Grainger ➤ cross was grasped by Olejnik as Sweeney hesitated, and Gilliead left three in his wake as United started to find their feet. Wyke touched it with his back to goal and Hery rattled a skewed volley wide.



An intricate set piece routine brought a thundering drive from Davies, as Exeter crept forward and found they had men to spare in the Carlisle box, and Gillespie had to tip it over as it threatened to creep in.

Joyce rasped a long range shot wide and Gilliead sent one right at Olejnik after another winding run as good football kept Carlisle in the opposition half. But Nicholls was disappointed at the other end when his 35-yard free kick dipped over the wall and straight at the keeper.

More good stuff from Gilliead brought yet another cut back from the lively forward, as the game flowed from one end to the other, but it was behind everyone and the visitors sensed a chance to burst forward. They moved it quickly and Holmes sank to the floor with his head in his hands as his goal bound effort was tipped wide by the full length Mark Gillespie.



crowd to its feet just before half time when he exchanged passes with Sweeney. It took him across the face of the 18 yard box and his through ball for Miller invited a shot. Butterfield stayed big to block it.

United sent the first warning shot of the second half with a toe poke from Gilliead which curled past the upright, and the same player curled a beauty of a cross into the six yard box but there was nobody there to apply a touch.

Things unexpectedly opened up for Luke Joyce 35 yards from goal and a clear sight of goal brought a thumping connection. Olejnik saw it late but he did enough to make the parry. Joyce then tried to turn provider with a clipped cross to meet the run of the unmarked Jason Kennedy.

His downward header brought a superb one-handed save as Wyke looked for the loose pieces.

Exeter sat deep but they were undone with 13 minutes left to go when Hery spun away with the ball on the edge of his own box. Asamoah pulled into space and he took his time to allow




players to get up in support as he jinked in and out of the box. Loan star shot and a first senior goal for the Newcastle United youngster.

# A COMPLETE RECORD



Any personal 'connection' of mine with Carlisle United and Exeter City, like that of the two clubs. goes back to 1958 and the Football League going nationwide with Third and Fourth Divisions instead of North and

South Divisions.

My first memory of 1958 is of standing with 8,000 others at Gillingham's Priestfield Stadium at 3pm on Saturday 8 February for a minute's silence to pay respect to the victims of the Munich plane crash.

Gillingham, along with Exeter, finished that 1957/8 season in the bottom half of Div 3 South as did Carlisle in Div 3 North so all three clubs had the doubtful privilege of becoming founder members of Division Four.

I watched Carlisle for the first time on Monday September 1 in the 1-1 draw at Gillingham. On October 4 Exeter won 2-1 at Brunton Park and in February did the double with the same score at St James' Park.

The Grecians came fifth in the table, but no play-offs in those days, so we met again in 59/60 when both games produced away wins.

United won a first ever promotion in 1962 - followed immediately by a first ever relegation! However by April 1964 Carlisle and Exeter finished in the top four along with Gillingham and Workington to earn another promotion.

For United the only way was 'up' to enjoy 12 years in the top two divisions, but City never made it out of the bottom two.

Fast forward to 2003 and Exeter and Carlisle are in the now familiar role of relegation candidates when they meet on January 18. I was at that game at St James' Park and saw City win 1-0 but they ended the season in 23rd place, a point behind United, and went down to the Conference.

When United joined them there after the next season, a 2-0 home win for City in the final game saw them both in the play-offs. Carlisle battled back into the EFL but Exeter had to wait another three years before returning via the play-offs.

Like United, the Grecians immediately won promotion from League Two so we met again in 2010/11 in League One.

United and City had some frantic tussles in 2016/17. I featured the score 3-2 in my last article and 3-2 for United was the result of both League 2 games. Level

on 71 points, we met again in the play-offs and Exeter were 3-1 up at Brunton Park until goals from John O'Sullivan ➤ and Shaun Miller levelled it at 3-2.



While the teams slogged it out in the Thursday evening second leg on

the south coast, I was in the Holiday Inn at Glasgow Airport, hoping for a few hours sleep before checking in for the 6am flight to Amsterdam.




The news from Exeter was not good, 2-0 down, ten minutes to go. Goals from Jason Kennedy and O'Sullivan and we were back in it. Then up popped Jack Stacev < who had been on loan at Carlisle two years earlier - to snatch a stoppage time winner for City.

So the Grecians went to Wembley but lost 2-1 to Blackpool whose goals came from ex- Carlisle man Brad Potts and future Carlisle striker (though injury prevented him making much impact) Mark Cullen.

The Grecians came fourth the next season but again lost the Wembley play-off final, this time 3-1 to Coventry.

Although we are at opposite ends of the country a few brave souls have played for both teams - most recently strikers Tristan Abraham, Ryan Bowman and Offrande Zanzala.

The meeting of legends teams here at Brunton Park on Sunday 24 April is already a mouth-watering list of United favourites, and we're delighted to confirm that another has been added with striker Michael Bridges dusting off the boots to join his teammates in the 2005/06 line-up on the day.

Bridges, now based in Newcastle, Australia, became a club hero when he first joined the Blues on-loan from Bristol City in November 2005, with a haul of three goals from seven appearances that led to a permanent move up north.

His overall tally became 23 strikes in 63 games as he played a huge part in the title-winning campaign that took the club into League One.

Never having hidden his affection for the Cumbrians, it comes as absolutely no surprise to hear that he's answered the call from friend and colleague Chris Lumsdon to take part in a fixture that has slightly more significance than being just another kickabout with a few old mates.

"I'm going to be honest, anything to do with Carlisle United and Brunton Park is always important as far as I'm concerned," he said, "And, with this, it's part of what I think is a wonderful idea with a few of the lads putting their heads together to find ways to help former players who perhaps aren't having the best of times.

"It was really nice when Lummy got in touch to see if I wanted to be involved because I knew straight away that it was something I wanted to be part of.

"Knowing that lads connected to Carlisle United are putting something together that means we can all help each other, should somebody find themselves struggling mentally, physically, financially, or whatever, then I think that's just a great initiative."

"As well as that, what you find with football is that there aren't many lads who actually get together or see each other that much once they've finished playing," he added. "You keep in touch and possibly talk or text every now and again, but it's the same as everybody else, they all have different things going on in their lives and it's really easy to lose contact with others.

"As an example, I got a bit jealous when I saw a photo of Karl Hawley. Chris Billy. Dennis Booth and Lummy having a drink together a short while ago, and they sent me a message to say hello while they were out.

"I was absolutely gutted that I couldn't be there with them. I think I'd have flown over just to have a drink with them, because they're from a group of people who mean so much.



"Knowing that we can all see each other for this game, and also knowing that it's for such a great reason makes it a no-brainer for me to be there, it really is as simple as that.

"My time at the club was very special for me, it gave me the love of the game back, and it was with a group of players who clicked and worked so well together. The management team of Simmo and Dennis were part of that, so coming to play in this game is something I feel I have to do."

Problems faced by players who have left the game aren't often discussed or highlighted, and it can often be the case that even the higher profile names face problems with the sudden change of direction in their lives.

"There are ex-players I've played with for many different clubs who have moved on to do different things, some in coaching or perhaps in the media, and we all say the same thing about how much your life changes from the moment your last playing contract ends," he commented.

"I have to admit that I found it very tough when I first retired. I called it my spaghetti junction because I gave a few things a go. I had a bar and a restaurant in the town of Newcastle over here in Australia, where I live, and I also got into coaching and a bit of media work.



"I found that I needed to keep as much purpose in my life as possible, because I think you have to wake up and know that you have something that matters to focus on. If you don't have that, you really struggle.

"We're not regimented as footballers, but you tend to know when you're training, when you're playing, and from that you pretty much know your daily routine.

"That's not just people in sport, that's the same for everybody who has a job in any walk of life, and initially when they retire they think it's fantastic.

"You saw it with people like Sir Bobby Robson, Roy Hodgson and Sir Alex Ferguson, they stayed in management for as long as they possibly could. Roy is back again. I'm sure they had people telling them just to relax and enjoy themselves, but it's nearly impossible because they need to have that purpose.

"I'm part of the Leeds United WhatsApp group and I've noticed over the last few years, particularly since Covid, that there's been a lot more of these groups where former players are getting together just to talk to each other, or to reach out.

"I've got one that Dom Matteo set up after his brain tumour, and a lot of the lads are in there having a laugh and joke, and it's sometimes just that simple kind of thing that can make a huge difference.

"Suddenly you're talking to like-minded people about anything and everything and that naturally makes you feel better.

"The group with the Carlisle lads opened up when we knew this game was coming and it's put a smile on my face, let's put it that way.

"I'm in a good position myself with family, media work and coaching, but I know that's not the same for everybody. Any little bit we can do to help each other is a personal plus for me."

Kick off is at 1pm on Sunday 24 April, right here at Brunton Park.

### **YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2021**

The club can now confirm its audited financial results for the year ended 30 June 2021.


For the second year in a row the club made a profit - we achieved a profit after tax of £397,000 (19/20: £782,000). This was despite the impact of Coronavirus and fans being excluded for almost all games. The key financial headlines are as follows:

- Profit after tax: £397,000 (19/20: £782,000). The profit is as reported in September 2021 www.carlisleunited.co.uk/news/2021/ september/chief-exec-september-update-part-3
- Headline turnover: £4.06m (19/20: £4.59m). This includes recurring business income from tickets, retail and commercial, one-off Coronavirus related income and Football Fortune from player sales and cups.



- Recurring business turnover: £616,000 (19/20: £1.36m). This is from tickets, retail and commercial activity and is estimated to be circa £1.2m lower in 20/21 than 'normal', due to Coronavirus effects. Recurring business turnover in the last year unaffected by Coronavirus was £1.85m in 18/19.
- Non-recurring, one-off business turnover: £825,000 (19/20: £200,000). This is from Premier League grant, iFollow streaming and fan donations arising from the Coronavirus pandemic.

- Coronavirus Job Retention Scheme income: £242,000 (19/20: £361,000). From the HM Government support scheme.
- This makes a total of one-off Coronavirus related income of £1.07m. Combined with cost savings from Coronavirus lockdowns and fan lockouts at game, this income fully balanced the £1.2m reduction in our 'normal' recurring business turnover.



Football Fortune: £1.07m (19/20: £1.45m). This includes £977,000 (19/20: £1.13m) of income earned from player transfers. Not all of that income was received in cash in 20/21. Some receipts will come in 21/22 and beyond. We have earned £2m from player sales in the last two years 19/20 and 20/21.



- Total wages & salaries costs: £2.4m (19/20: £2.5m). The reduction relates mainly to Coronavirus effects.
- Total Football Expenditure: £2.0m (19/20: £2.0m) including Player Costs. Spending on the football department activities was maintained despite Coronavirus.
- Net assets: £5.3m (19/20: £4.9m) at 30 June 2021 including £7.6m attributable to stadium fixed assets.
- Net cash in hand: £1.24m (19/20: £396,000) at 30 June 2021 being cash less overdrafts.
- Debtors receivable for player sales: £213,000 (19/20: £587,000) at 30 June 2021. These will be collected in 21/22 and beyond. This excludes other contingent add-on amounts or possible sellon income, which is not certain.

- VAT deferrals: £104,000 at 30 June 2021 by agreement with HMRC, arising from Coronavirus. This was settled in full as agreed during 2021.
- Total debt: £3.16m (19/20: £3.06m) at 30 June 2021 with no new debt advances or debt repayments being received from or made to PurePay Retail Limited or Pioneer Food Group in 20/21. The change in the year comprises accrued interest only.
- Player transfer receipts: £1.35m (19/20: £590,000).

The Audited Annual Accounts for the year ended 30 June 2021 have been approved and lodged at Companies House, and will be available there shortly. We have also made them available on the official website so that fans can see the information - search the site to download them.

Chief Executive Nigel Clibbens said: "The filing of the audited Annual Accounts and detail being made public now is very much historic. However, the key financial headlines have already been shared in detailed financial updates given to fans since the year end.

"The 20/21 financial results are excellent in the circumstances and show us in a sound position dayto-day.

"The underlying trading of the club continued to hold up well in the challenging circumstances on and off the field.

"We fully absorbed all exceptional adverse financial effects of Coronavirus (through a combination of cost savings, fan donations in lieu of refunds, claims under the HM Government Coronavirus Job Retention Scheme and other one-off Coronavirus related income. such as iFollow and grants from the Premier League).

"Clearly player transfer income was again important. This remains a crucial element of our funding and operating model each year.

"A full and detailed explanation of 20/21 results is contained in the Annual Accounts. Again, this year they provide comprehensive information. This year we have added further disclosure of a cash flow statement. This is part of the commitment to be transparent about the club's finances and the issues and challenges we face."

"At 30 June 2021, we had cash in hand and further transfer cash due in, and no creditor pressure or debt repayments scheduled for 21/22 except for small amounts to the EFL. The legacy VAT deferral outstanding at the year end has been settled since.

"We are pleased that we were able to emerge from a difficult period, well-placed financially, with few legacy Coronavirus issue. In summary, our day-to-day cash position remains sound and our trade creditors position remains good with the trading liabilities remain low. All our PAYE and VAT liabilities continue to be paid up in full and on time. We also recognise the club faces uncertainties and challenges going forward. As we have changed course and takeover discussions ceased towards the end of 2021, there is some uncertainty until the matter of the repayment of the PurePay loan is resolved. The backing of all those who have supported us has been crucial and we hope that will continue as we face the future. Thank you all."
