FROM THE MANAGER PAUL SIMPSON

It's another in our series of home games against teams who are battling at the top end of the table and their run of one defeat from their last six games has taken them to the brink of the automatic promotion places.

With so much still to play for at both ends of the table it means that every point will be contested through this final stage of the season by every opponent we come up against.

But I also wanted to make sure that they didn't lose sight of the fact that for the previous nine games since I came to the club they've given it everything, and the points tally they built up is testament to that.


It's now about finishing the job off properly, and as a management team we'll be making sure that the training and preparation we do is with that aim at the forefront of our minds.



MANSFIELD TOWN



Mansfield announced Nigel Clough as their new manager in November 2020. Clough joined the Stags after spells in charge of Derby County, Sheffield United and Burton Albion.

As a player, he made over 300 league appearances for Nottingham Forest, becoming the second highest scorer in Forest's history, before moving to Liverpool in 1993. He also spent time with Manchester City and Burton Albion as a player, in a career that saw him make 14 caps for England.

His managerial career started with non-league Burton Albion in 1998, and after steady progress in each of his first three seasons, the Brewers were crowned champions of the Northern Premier League in his fourth term at the helm. Burton were on course to earn promotion to the Football League for the first time in their history in the 2008/09 season, as Clough led them to the top of the Conference table, which included a run of 11 straight victories along the way.

He moved to Championship outfit Derby County in 2009, leaving a table-topping Burton side who

would eventually go on to secure their Football League status in that season. Derby had fears of relegation before he took charge, but the now-54-yearold improved the club's form and finished 14th in his first full term, four places higher than the previous campaign.

He joined Sheffield United in 2013, and despite the Blades sitting in the relegation zone when he took charge, they ended the campaign seventh in League One. Sheffield United also became the first third-tier side to reach the semi-finals of the FA Cup since 2001. a run which included victories over Premier League outfits Aston Villa and Fulham. This success led to Clough being named as the FA Cup Manager of the Year. He returned to Burton Albion in 2015, guiding the Brewers to the Championship for the first time in their history.

Oates joined the Stags on a free transfer following the expiration of his contract at Hartlepool. Oates, who can play up front or out wide, fired in 18 goals last season as the Pools won promotion to Sky Bet League Two.

Starting his career as a youngster at Barnsley, the 26-year-old signed his first professional contract as a second-year scholar with the club, after winning the Academy Scholar of the Year award. The forward appeared ten times for the Tykes, whilst also spending time on loan with Gainsborough, Stockport, Grimsby and Chester during his spell at Oakwell.

Oates moved permanently from Barnsley 2015, signing for Hartlepool United. 100 He made over appearances for the Pools over three seasons, before signing for Morecambe in 2018. The former Barnsley man found the net six times in Morecambe colours before a return to Hartlepool last year, where he would finish as top scorer in a memorable season for the Pools.



The home team set the pace with a quick move down the right wing when Guy robbed possession with a superbly timed challenge. He found Alessandra, and his ripped pass was touched by Kayode as he turned his man on the penalty spot. His shot was blocked and it spun just wide of the target.

A 23-yard free kick was awarded at the other end and set piece specialist Mal Benning appeared to take

control as he placed the ball in readiness for the strike. It was a double bluff as Maris took over, but his attempt was deflected high by the wall

United almost picked the lock when tenacity from

before he could finish it off.

Rilev saw him retrieve possession before sending Lewis Alessandra A on a run. He bypassed the back line with a clipped through ball, and Patrick was on the overlap to cut it back. Mellish had made a move but it was swept away

Unbelievable defending from Sweeney prevented a certain goal on 16 minutes when Patrick sparked a move as he won the ball in his own half. It was fed to Alessandra, and his intelligent through ball left Riley with just Stech to beat. The keeper was taken out of it by a powerful volley but the Stags centre back somehow got there to make a stunning clearance off the line.

Time seemed to stand still on 27 minutes when a corner from Guy spun up off a defender. It bounced and twisted for an age inside the six-yard area as both Hayden and Bennett tried to get a boot on it. The stopwatch was eventually restarted and Benning wafted it away.

Patrick sent an effort from distance right at Stech as both teams played their part in a lively encounter, and the forward was immediately back to help out with the breaking up of an away attack as yellow shirts flooded the home area.

Good work from Mellish saw him bring Patrick into play 23-yards out, as United picked up the pace, but an outsretched toe from Sweeney was enough to bend his attempt away for a corner. There were loud screams for handball as Anderton recovered it with a cross, but referee Peter Wright showed no interest.





The Blues took the lead just before half time with what can only be described as a stunning goal. Jack Armer marked his first league start with a telling through ball and Omari Patrick

✓ initailly trapped the ball with a perfect first touch and with his back to the target. He took everyone by surprise with his second touch - a crisp volley on the turn which whistled its way into the back of the net.

Jon Mellish found the side netting when a back heel from Alessandra invited him to go for it from a tight angle, but that was that for the first period as the Blues took their one-goal advantage into the break.

Pace and power from Anderton saw him sprint 40-yards with Charsley in his wake. His cross was cut out, and Mansfield responded with a good pass from Benning to Reid. He rolled it back for Lapslie to strike, but Hayden closed it down.

Skill you needed to see to believe came from Alessandra on 50 minutes when he dragged the ball back, spun it on his heel and left two markers for dead inside his own half. He was able to relieve the pressure as he sent Patrick up the right flank.

Confidence seemed to flow through the home side as they tried all kinds of tricks, and Riley wasn't afraid to shoot when the ball came his way. It hit a thigh and curled away to safety.

Riley was almost the man of the moment again when Armer nudged a pass his way. He was at distance, but he dropped a shoulder before letting it go. Stech had to dive low to make the two-handed save.

A heavy challenge from Clarke on Kayode caused concern, and he was booked, as was Bennett as the home team vented their frustration.

The decibel levels were lifted and Patrick looked for glory again as he angled a run past his man. His shot touched Sweeney and bulged the side of the net.

Another great home move was sparked when Anderton went on a run tight by the touchline. He found Mellish, and he dug deep to take two out before pulling it back. Riley was there again, but another block meant he was thwarted.

Substitute Gime Touré curled a long range punt at Stech as the clock ticked down, and United had to work hard through the closing stages to protect their goal.

AWAY TEAM CONNECTIONS WITH KEN WOOD

A COMPLETE RECORD UNITED v MANSFIELD



Getting towards the end of season now - the Easter weekend used to be the when promotion dreams were dashed or boosted and relegation nightmares became a reality.

Thanks to that amazing four weeks from 26 February to 26 March we no longer have to worry about repeating those away days of 18 years ago to Aldershot, Barnet, Woking, Dagenham etc, etc.

Mansfield, on the other hand, recently made their last trip for a while to Scunthorpe and hosted Sutton United at Field Mill/One Call stadium for the first time and will now want to make sure of a play-off place.

United and 'The Stags' have more connections than I had anticipated. We first met in 1932/3 when they were switched to Div 3 North after one debut season in Div 3 South - honours even with 3-1 home wins in both games. Mansfield moved back to the South Division in 1937 and then came North again from 1947. I wonder what their players thought of midwinter trips to Barrow, Gateshead and Hartlepool rather than Torquay, Exeter and Bristol?

Their visit here in December 1956 promised no real excitement with both teams in the lower half of the table so fewer than 5000 spectators turned up at Brunton Park. The absentees missed a 6-1 home



win and four goals from South African centre forward Alf Ackerman ◀ in his sixth game for United. Both teams won promotion from Division 4 to Division 3 and by Easter 1965 both were challenging for a further promotion. United were on a great run of 14 wins from 18 games.

Bristol City held us to 1-1 here on Good Friday and we then lost 2-0 at Mansfield on Easter Monday. However, the very next evening, Tuesday 20 April, United beat Mansfield in the final game of the season 3-0 in front of 16000 jubilant Brunton Park fans to finish top with 60 points. Bristol City won promotion too with 59 points but Mansfield missed out on goal average. They eventually moved up to Division 2 in 1977 just as United came back down to Division 3!

Carlisle and Mansfield both did well in the FA Cup in 74/5 and 18293 fans saw the fifth round tie at Field Mill when Bobby Owen's goal earned a 1-0 win for United. We both enjoyed EFL Trophy success at Wembley - for Mansfield it was just the once, when they beat Bristol City 5-4 on penalties in 1987 after a 1-1 draw.

A rare television appearance for our clubs came on Friday 11 April 1997 - 0-0 draw at Field Mill in Division 3. That result clinched the third automatic promotion place for United just behind Wigan Athletic and Fulham and well ahead of Northampton who eventually joined us after winning the play-offs.

One of Keith Curle's early management jobs was with Mansfield from 2002 to 2004 and ten years later he was in Carlisle for a four-year spell.

Don O'Riordan had an impressive 100% Carlisle appearance record of 92 consecutive games in the number 5 shirt for 83/4 and 84/5 before moving on to other clubs including Mansfield.

Our Anfield League Cup goal-scoring hero, Derek Asamoah had played for Mansfield in 2004/5, while Reggie Lambe came directly to Brunton Park in 2016 after a couple of seasons at Field Mill. Others to represent our two clubs include Rhys Bennett, Kevin Hurst, Adam Murray and Hayden White.

SLO UPDATE WITH SIMON CLARKSON

CHANGE IN THE AIR



Supporter Liaison Officer

Last week we saw Crawley Town taken over by American investors,

Wagmi United who are promising to use Web 3.0 technologies to empower the English fourth-tier soccer club's fanbase to make key decisions. I wonder if anyone knows what this means?

The new owners said "If we're trying to build a community club, and we are, then we have to build in mechanisms to hold ourselves accountable. So, if Crawley doesn't get promoted to League One by the end of our second season, which we think is about 50/50, then we underperformed. If we underperform, Crawley Town fans should get to vote on who the next directors of the club are."

I am all for embracing modern things into football but such a huge change, could make for an interesting watch.

We await with interest the outcomes from the fan led review. I like the initial findings from the first phase, but you do wonder, how long will it take to having actual proposals and then what is going to be the mechanism for implementing any changes? Without significant support it feels a bit like turkeys voting for Christmas. The review is not all about finances. Other things are important too. Heritage and culture for example. Clubs are key community assets; the club badge is the identity, and the colours define them. If there was one aspect of the Wrexham takeover that I thought they got right, it was in respect of these areas that were guaranteed to be protected.

Scanning the internet, I have come across some possible future changes to the game. I score each one out of 10 as to how much I would support the proposals.

- Shorter matches (in conjunction with point 2).
 Two halves of 30 mins. 5/10
- 2. Stop the clock. No more injury time but stop the clock every time the ball goes out of play. 8/10
- 3. Unlimited subs. Remove the cap on number of subs used. 1/10
- 4. Five-minute sin bin for yellow cards. 5/10
- Throw ins replaced with dead balls taken with feet. 3/10

A mixed bag of proposals in my view. I would be happy with options one and two being implemented as this may discourage time wasting which I feel is a scourge of the game. Option three gets a big thumbs down from me and I know that option four has not gone down well in non-league football where it has been in use for bookings for dissent. I would be concerned if every throw in became an opportunity to lump the ball into the box.

As this season ends (written with 5 games left), we don't know what is in store for us next season. For me that's the beauty of football. We will go again with fresh hope but with the uncertainty of investment, ownership and who will lead us. It feels like we are just about to start on another lap of the Brunton Park rollercoaster. Hold on to your hats!





Carlisle United's #EFLWeekOfAction activities included a visit from first-team players Jamie Devitt and Callum Guy to the Tuesday afternoon Mental Health football session in the Neil Sports Centre.

The pair watched the first part of a keenly contested game before a break was called - with the score at 3-1 - and the group members were then given the chance to ask questions and chat with their special guests.

When asked what had changed to bring such a good run of results under the new manager, Jamie Devitt said: "It's such a difficult question to answer. With him knowing the area and the club I think him coming in brought everybody together, and that was massive.

"In the games before he came you could feel that the fans were nervous, but all of a sudden there was a really positive feeling around the club, in the dressing room and from the supporters, and I think everybody fed off each other. Things have gone on from there."

And on what it feels like to have played a part in a goal that meant so much, like the last-minute header from Morgan Feeney at Oldham, Callum Guy said: "You've no idea. There just isn't a feeling like it.

"They're all supporters, and meeting the players is fantastic, it really is. A lot of them are dealing with things on a daily basis and the boost this gives them simply can't be measured, other than in terms of the fact you can tell that they're absolutely buzzing that it's happened."
